



3 Day HELLFIRE PASS Anzac Day Tour (Code: 3ANZAC)

Tour details

On this amazing 3 day historical tour you will visit the POW war cemetery Chungkai, visit the Railway War museum, walk over the famous Bridge on the River Kwai, The Weary Dunlop Memorial Centre followed by a train ride on the Death Railway to Nam Tok.

On 25th of April, we will go to Hellfire Pass for the Dawn Service and visit the war graves cemetery in Kanchanaburi to attend the Commemorative Service. See the itinerary below for more details or contact our office.

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Itinerary

DAY (1) 24 APRIL – (L,D)

7.30am to 8am Pick up From Hotel Bangkok and travel the 2 ½ hour journey to Kanchanaburi where we meet our local guides

We take a train excursion on the “Death Railway” over the line constructed by the POW’s and other “slave” laborers to Nam Tok.

Lunch at Nam Tok Station (included)

We visit the Weary Dunlop Memorial Park, a remarkable tribute to the Australian POW surgeon Lieutenant-Colonel E.E. 'Weary' Dunlop who is revered in Australia as the iconic image of the self-sacrifice, courage and compassion manifested by Australian doctors in captivity. What makes the park unusual is that it is located in Thailand and was created a Thai.

Then on to Hellfire Pass for a guided tour through the pass before the Services.

You will view the new Interpretive Centre with its moving displays and visual presentations. then walk parts of the line – see cuttings and relics, “Hammer and Tap” along the old line in the pass, compressor etc.

Check into the Jungle Raft Hotel on the Kwai Noi River near Hellfire Pass. Welcome Drinks and maybe time for a swim and relax with a beer or two - then dinner. **(Included)**



DAY (2) 25 APRIL - (B,L,D)

Today is a full programme starting at 3:00am in the morning

Dawn Service is held in Hell Fire Pass (5.30am start)

Return to our hotel for breakfast and check out then transfer to

Kanchanaburi. **(Included)** On the way we may have time to walk along the 500m Wang Pho wooden viaduct clinging perilously to the cliffs for support (also known as Dangerous Curve) in the Tham Krasae district north of Kanchanaburi. You will also see a large cave accessible from the viaduct which now contains a large golden Buddha and is a place of worship. This cave was used as a hospital and air raid shelter for POW’s during construction the railway.



In Kanchanaburi visit the Donrak Cenotaph and attend the ceremonies at the War Graves Cemetery.

After Lunch we visit the War Museum Burma Thailand Railway (**Included**), view the Bridge on The River Kwai and walk over the Bridge where we catch a boat to the POW war cemetery at Chungkai, the first and major Campsite during construction at the Thailand end.

Check into our centrally located hotel in Kanchanaburi (dinner included) where you have time for an afternoon nap and relax. These evening it is only a short walk to the bars and restaurants in old Kanchanaburi.

DAY (3) 26 APRIL – (B)

Today we travel back to Bangkok through the old Siam capital of Ayutthaya, about 80 kilometres north of Bangkok. It was capital of the Kingdom of Siam, and a prosperous international trading port, from 1350 until razed by the Burmese in 1767. The ruins of the old city now form the Ayutthaya Historical Park, an archaeological site that contains palaces, Buddhist temples, monasteries and statues. The park is on an island between 3 rivers. Ayutthaya has been stated as Thailand's Angkor Wat.

Arrival late afternoon into Bangkok at your selected hotel (not included – please ask if you wish to extend your touring arrangements)

Optional Extra Tours: As an alternative to Ayutthaya we can arrange an exclusive tour to visit the world famous Tiger Safari Park Project touching the true nature of the amazing tigers and other kind of wild animals such as deer, wild fowl and wild boar.

Elephant Camp:

- Enjoy swimming, bathing and jungle river rafting and trekking with the elephants **700 Baht pp.**
- Elephant rides **500 Baht pp.**
- River Rafting **350 Baht pp.**
- (Time allowing) Visit Erwan Waterfall **600 Baht pp** entrance fee into the National Park, feed the wild monkeys at the Kaset Buddha Cave and walk along the infamous trestle bridge which is part of the Death Railway.

Remarks:

- Distance approx. 350 Kilometre round trip from Bangkok. Travel time around 3.00 hours each way
- Vehicles are modern comfortable high top vans with A/C Stereo sound TV - all the bells and whistles.
- Transportation van, driver, historical guide.
- Pre and post accommodation and touring in Bangkok and around Thailand can be arranged.

Warnings: Thailand is very hot at this time of year, please bring sun screen etc. Don't forget to bring a cap, towel, sun glasses, energy drinks, medication etc. Always keep back up SD cards and back up your photos. Make sure your camera batteries are fully charged.
